Abuse and Neglect



Abuse of older and disabled adults (at-risk adults) is one of the most undetected and underreported problems in the U.S. Abuse can involve physically harming or distressing the at-risk adult or not doing something that a person has a duty to do, such as a caregiver not providing medications to an at-risk adult who needs them.

Neglect occurs when someone intentionally or unknowingly withholds basic necessities or care. Self-neglect refers to a person's inability to provide care and support to him or herself.
