Leisure...why/why not?

- Is participating in leisure important to you?

Sometimes things change

- How might these constraints change now that you have a disability/illness?
 - Work demands?
 - Amount of free time?
 - Transportation?
 - Money?
 - Limited work/income, need to purchase medical equipment/or pay for care, increased cost of adapted recreation/leisure equipment



Leisure on a budget

- How can we limit the stress about money?
 - Adapt leisure interests
 - Find discounts
 - Apply for a grant/scholarship
 - Have a fundraiser
 - Look into waiver programs (for caregiving needs)
 - Ask your community for assistance
 - Local Parks and Recreation
 - YMCA
 - Community or church organizations



New activities?

- Adapt leisure interests
 - Adopt new interests that require little to no money
 - Examples:
 - Nature activities, bird watching, repurposed/recycled crafting, book club, recreational sports leagues, geocaching
 - Alter how you participate in current leisure interests
 - Examples:
 - Instead of buying books or renting movies- borrow them from the library for FREE
 - Game night at home instead of out



Ways to save

- Find discounts
 - General public
 - Discount websites (Groupon, Livingsocial, etc.)
 - Community freebies/discounts
 - Based on disability
 - May or may not be advertised
 - Doesn't hurt to ask!
 - Based on other criteria (age, military, etc.)
 - AAA, AARP, college student



DIY

- Find simple home-based modifications
 - Example: Using box for card holder, use tape for Wii adaptor, PVC pipe fishing rod holder, etc.
- Use your friends and family
 - Example: Someone who can weld could easily fashion a rifle rest from scrap metal; someone who does woodworking could make a card holder or a billiards bridge, etc.

Get free money?

- Hold a fundraiser
- Grants and Scholarships
 - There is assistance to help purchase recreation/leisure equipment
 - Usually have requirements
 - Can take extended time to be approved and receive
- Start a GoFundMe account

- Partnering with a community group
- Cookout with raffle tickets
- Sporting tournament

Using your community

- Ask your community for assistance
 - Could the equipment be beneficial to others in your community?
 - It's more likely that a business could afford to purchase equipment easier than you could...
 - They may get a tax credit for increasing access
 - Contact them/write a letter
 - Equipment on loan/rent from community programs?
 - Atlanta area residents are able to rent/loan equipment from Shepherd
